# **Course Description:**

This course will explore Hindu texts on the subjects of dharma, knowledge, yoga, ritual worship, and general morality. Several Upaniṣads, select chapters of the  $Bhagavad-g\bar{\iota}t\bar{a}$ , teachings and allegorical stories from the  $Bh\bar{a}gavata~Pur\bar{a}na$ , and procedure for ritual  $p\bar{u}j\bar{a}$  from the  $Hari-bhakti-vil\bar{a}sa$  provide our primary textual material. Class discussion will focus on essential philosophical and religious truths contained in the readings.

**Course Requirements**: adequate preparation of assigned primary texts and supplementary readings, demonstrated by thoughtful contributions to **class discussion** and **short response papers** as assigned; **three comprehensive, in-class quizzes** based on assigned readings and class lectures; a **final 5-6 page paper** due the last day of class. Regular participation in classroom discussion is expected.

**Grading**: Grades will be based on **three quizzes** and a **final exam** in the exam period following the end of term (60%), an **8-page paper** (20%) and classroom participation, including occasional, short response papers (20%). Students will be called upon in class to answer questions pertaining to the week's reading, as well as participate in discussion. **No** make-ups for missed exams will be given without valid medical proof or a signed letter from a student dean. Extra credit may be earned through in-class presentations. A = 100-90; B+ = 89-85; B = 84-80; C+ = 79-75; C = 74-70; D = 69-65; F = 64 and below.
